Requirements	
Range of Historic events selected	To have one event per decade - e.g. 1917, 1923, 1932, 1946, 1951, 1967, 1974, 1988, 1992, 2004, 2011
Level of importance	Must be a significant local Guiding event for Singapore Guiding History
Presentation	To include self-illustration, pictures and photos. Guiding related photos e.g. Thinking Day Can be Typewritten Content page with matching pages, starting from the earlier years Submission can be in hardcopy
Assessment criteria	
1.	Relevancy of the chosen event / Accuracy of information
2.	Presentation (layout / creativity)
3.	Reflection - value learnt + how to apply in life
