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1. Booking of Camp Christine

(a) Bookings can be submitted during the window period as shown below:

Booking priority will be given to schools and GGS members during the school holiday period.

If you are unable to select dates/ times of your choice when booking your preferred slots, it means that the slots are already held by another person. If you have flexible dates/ time, please proceed to book alternative dates, otherwise, send an email to queries@girlguides.org.sg or call 62599391

(b) with the following requirements:

- The applicant must be at least 21 years of age.
- Bookings from student groups of Tertiary Institutions need to be endorsed by the respective institutions.
- Vendors managing camp programme for MOE schools will need to produce supporting documents from schools.
- Sufficient facilities must be booked for the proposed number of people.
- The campsite prioritises educational and team building activities. Religious activities (i.e., religious rituals, worships or services) are **not allowed** at campsite.

(c) Booking is on a first-come first-served basis. Successful applicant must pay GGS within 14 working days per the charges stated on the invoice provided upon booking confirmation or if there are other interested parties for same dates, first right of refusal will be provided and payment must be made in order to hold the booking or it will be released for entities willing to make first payment

2. Use of Camp Christine facilities and obstacle courses

(a) Lodges

- 4 lodges are available for booking. Please refer to Annex A for layout.
- Each lodge is equipped with a kitchen, bathrooms and toilets, dormitory with 20 bunk beds (40 units) and a small multi-purpose hall.
- Each lodge can house a maximum of 40 campers.
- Should usage of the 2nd level of the lodge (the dormitory) be required during the period of booking, bedsheets, pillows and pillowcase will be provided. Charges for laundry apply.
- Separate dormitory lodge(s) should be booked for each gender.
- For bookings of obstacle course(s) or camping cluster(s), a lodge must be booked for wet-weather programme.
- Each lodge can be provided with a set of crockery and cutlery for 40 pax. The crockery and cutlery per lodge is colour coded. No substitution for loss of crockery is allowed.
- Charges of \$60 will be imposed on damages and/or loss of equipment.

(b) Outdoor Camping Clusters

- 3 camping clusters are available for booking. Please refer to Annex A for layout.
- Additional canvas tents are available for rental if required.
- There should be separate sleeping tents for each gender.



- Campers are advised to book facilities for wet-weather programme. If no facilities are booked, on-the-spot booking may be accepted subjected to availability and surcharge of \$20 per facility in addition to the stipulated charges.
- Charges of \$120 will be imposed on tears on canvas tent. If the damage is too extensive and beyond repair, charges of damages will be assessed and advised accordingly.

(c) Olave Hall (multi-purpose hall)

- 1 multi-purpose hall available for booking. Please refer to Annex A for layout.
- Olave Hall may be used for quiet games, film shows, etc.
- Ball games are not allowed in Olave Hall.
- PA system is not available.

(d) BP Ring (for Campfire)

- 1 BP Ring available for booking. Please refer to Annex A for layout.
- Only 1 booking is allowed per booking application.
- Campfires / barbecues may be held at the BP Ring. The fireplace and site must be cleaned and cleared after use.

(e) BP Eco Challenge, Land and Water

- BP Eco Challenge courses are not to be used without qualified supervision.
- Certified and licensed safety officers will be provided by EDU with a ratio of 1:40 participants.
- For students' participation, a ratio of Instructor to Students of 1:10 is required.
- For adults' participation, a ratio of Instructor to Students of 1:10 is required.
- For BP Eco Challenge (Water) only:
 - Personal floatation devices (PFD) will be issued to all participants.
 - Participants who are unable to swim must be alerted to instructors and safety officers

(f) Outdoor Cooking

- Outdoor cooking must be done with the supervision of instructors or trainers.
- This program will be conducted in Phase 2.

Note:

- Equipment returned to the campsite should be cleaned and in the condition that they were issued.
- The applicant shall be responsible for any loss and/or damage of equipment by her or his campers. Any loss or damage identified by GGS staff at the time of check-out will be charged against the deposit of \$120. If the amount payable exceeds the deposit, the additional charges must be paid to GGS within 7 working days from the date of check-out. Failing to do so may result in the rejection of future applications.
- Action will be taken against users who flout the rules and regulations for use of Camp Christine. This may result in forfeiture of deposit and immediate eviction from the campsite.
- Campers must ensure that they comply with the prevailing national policies on safe distancing.



3. Arrival and Departure

- (a) Applicant must report personally to the GGS staff on arrival. The applicant must produce the approval notification to the GGS staff when checking-in.
- (b) Campers are not allowed to enter the campsite after 8pm as the campsite gates will be closed by the Camp Warden.
- (c) Check-in and Check-out Time

4. Food

- (a) No beef and pork (including but not limited to bacon, sausages, luncheon meat, ham etc) are allowed in Camp Christine premises. Only Halal certified food is permitted.
- (b) Alcoholic drinks are NOT allowed in Camp Christine premises.

5. Usage of Camp Christine

- (a) GGS adopts the 7 Principles of Leave No Trace (LNT) in our programmes. Campers are to practice LNT principles throughout their stay at Camp Christine. Refer to Annex B on Examples of Applying LNT Principles in Camp Christine.
- (b) Activities that involve the use of water (e.g. water bombs etc) are not allowed in the lodges or Olave Hall.
- (c) Smoking, gambling and pets are not allowed in the campsite.
- (d) GGS reserves the right to reject any application.
- (e) Any non-compliance with the above may result in forfeiture of deposit and immediate eviction from the campsite.

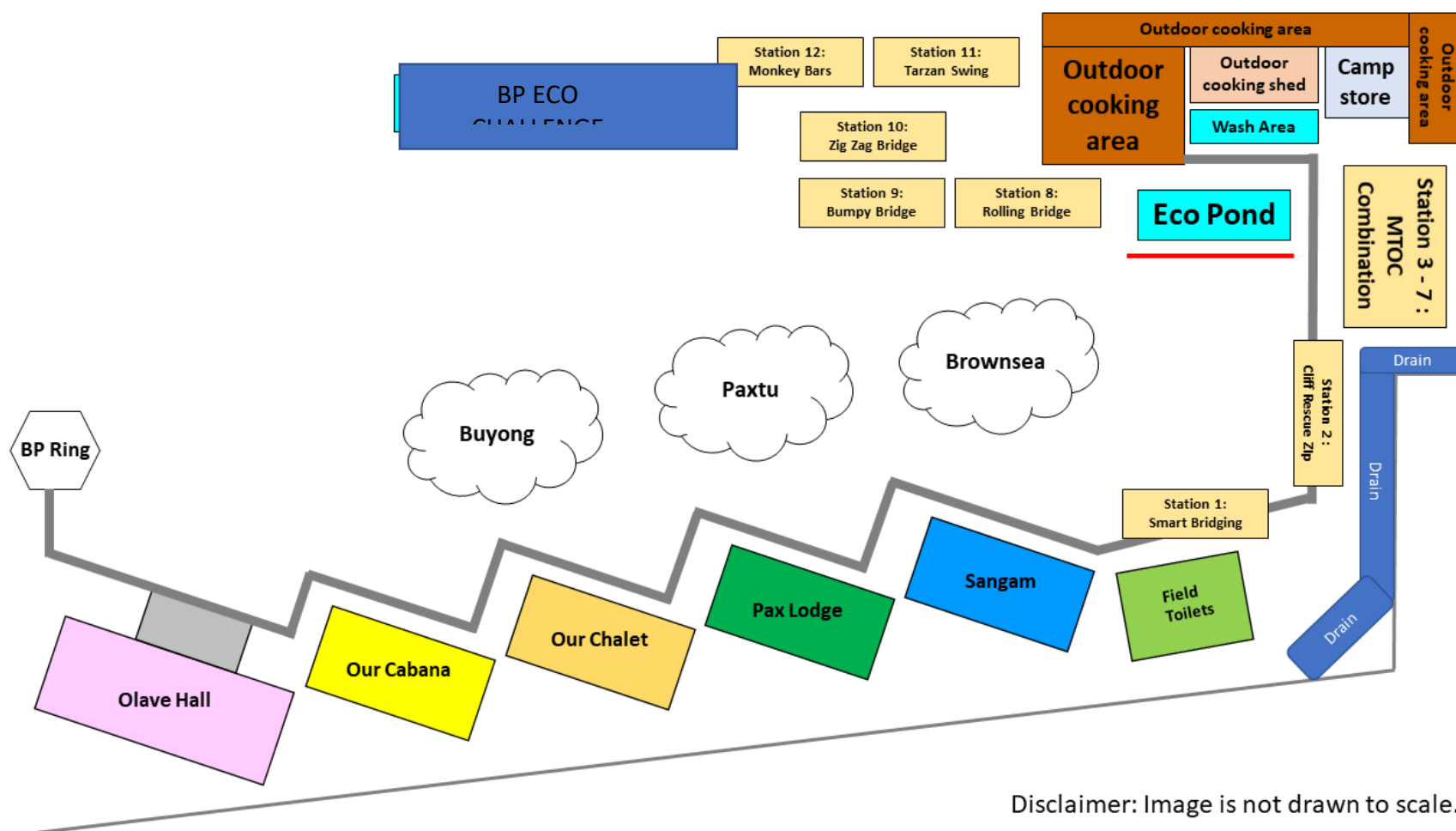

Annex B: Examples of Applying LNT Principles in Camp Christine

The 7 Principles of LNT provide an easily understood framework of minimum impact practices for anyone visiting the outdoors. Although LNT has its roots in backcountry settings, the Principles have been adapted so that they can be applied anywhere. Each Principle covers a specific topic and provides detailed information for minimizing impacts.

1. Plan Ahead And Prepare

- Know the regulations and special concerns for the area you'll visit.
- Prepare for extreme weather, hazards, and emergencies.

2. Travel And Camp On Durable Surfaces

- Good campsites are found, not made.
- Running along the walkway and going up and down the slopes are strongly discouraged.

3. Dispose Of Waste Properly

- Pack it in, pack it out. Inspect your campsite and rest areas for trash or spilled foods. Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter.

4. Leave What You Find

- Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Leave rocks, plants and other natural objects as you find them. Camping area should be kept clean, neat and tidy at all times.
- All borrowed equipment is to be returned in its original condition.
- Only blu tack can be used to put up signages within the campsite. All signages put up must be removed before check-out.
- No tampering of electrical extension or typing of ropes in/on the lodges.
- Preserve the past: examine, but do not touch cultural or historic structures and artifacts.
- Unauthorized digging of trench, ditches and holes are prohibited.
- Beds in the lodges should not be moved.

5. Minimize Campfire Impacts

- Campfires can cause lasting impacts to the environment. Where fires are permitted, use established fire rings, fire pans, or mound fires.
- Burn all wood and coals to ash, put out campfires completely, then scatter cool ashes.

6. Respect Wildlife

- Observe wildlife from a distance. Do not follow or approach them.
- Never feed animals. Feeding wildlife damages their health, alters natural behaviors, and exposes them to predators and other dangers.
- Protect wildlife and your food by storing rations and trash securely.

7. Be Considerate Of Other Visitors

- Switch off all lights when not in use.
- Respect other visitors and be courteous to protect the quality of other camper's experience. All activities must stop by midnight (i.e. 2359 hours)
- Let nature's sounds prevail. Avoid loud voices and noises.
- Crockery, cutlery and bed linens are not to be used for games. Walkways should not be obstructed.
- Naked flames are not permitted inside the lodge.
- No wasting and playing with water.
