- To submit a video of a max duration of 3 minutes that highlights the Brownie(s) in action.
- The video recording of the activity and the softcopy of the template provided below must be submitted together with the other items above by **Tuesday, 25<sup>th</sup> March 2024 (before 5pm)**
- It is COMPULSORY to complete the template below with all required information.
- 2. Brownie will be asked to verbally share their reflection during a Face-to-face Test on **Friday, 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2024.**

### Compliance:

- The activity can be conducted individually or with a partner who is also a CCAB candidate.
- Both partnering CCAB candidate submission must NOT be of similar or duplicate work.

Please refer to how Proficiency and Interest Badges should be sewn below.

## Order of sewing badges on sleeves:

- 1) All Proficiency Badges in pairs (right sleeve). When a Brownie has earned more than 3 pairs, the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> badges should flank the top pair of Proficiency Badges.
- 2) When a girl has earned more than 12 Proficiency Badge, the 13<sup>th</sup> badge and thereafter may be sewn on the sash that can be worn across the uniform.
- 3) Similarly, Interest/Partners/WAGGGS badges should be sewn on the left sleeve of the uniform.
