OVERVIEW

WTD Circular #3 outlines the pre-event preparations, main celebrations, and guidelines for decentralized WTD activities in schools. Key points include:

WTD Celebrations - 22 February 2025

1. Stamp Card & Interactive Booths

Each member should have a <u>stamp card</u> to explore <u>interactive booths</u>. Complete the card to access exclusive redemption items on a first-come, first-served basis.

2. WTD Pennies Collection

Units/members are encouraged to contribute WTD Pennies at the Registration Counter by dropping them in the designated box.

3. Unit Registration

Only one Guider per school needs to register on behalf of the entire Unit. A QR code will be available at the event to streamline the registration process.

4. Mass Dance during the Celebrations

Do learn the dance in advance. A tutorial is provided.

5. Featured Badges

Learn exciting ways for girls to earn <u>featured Proficiency & Interest Badges</u>.

Decentralized WTD Celebrations – 25 February 2025 (Commemoration Day)

6. Plastic Tide Turner Challenge Badge Activities

All Units are encouraged to conduct the Plastic Tide Turner Challenge Badge activities on the same day. Please refer to the Plastic <u>Tide Turner Challenge Package</u> for further information.

7. Guide House Opening Hours

A) PLASTIC TIDE TURNERS

The **Plastic Tide Turners Challenge Badge (PTTCB)** empowers youth to lead in the fight against plastic pollution. Unsustainable plastic use and ineffective waste management have led to a crisis, with marine litter and microplastics harming our oceans, ecosystems, and health. The PTTCB calls on all to take action and champion solutions to plastic pollution.

This year, the badge activity is integrated into the WTD Celebrations in two parts, both of which must be completed to earn it. It is recommended to complete Part 2 on Commemoration Day, 25 February 2025; if not, it can be held later that week. Participants must submit their completed badges by 31 March 2025 to earn the Plastic Tide Turner Badge.




B) DANCE TUTORIAL

C) TRAFFIC FLOW & REGISTRATION FLOW (FOR ACTION BY GUIDERS)



E) REMINDER ON WTD 2025 THEME PATCH & STAMP CARD COLLECTION

The theme patch and the stamp card are an integral part of WTD and we encourage all Units, YA, HQ Guiders and Trefoil Guild members to collect their theme patch and stamp cards before the celebrations. Please nominate ONE representative from each school to collect them from the GGS Office.

Brownies & Guides should sew the theme patch (Brownies: above the six emblem; Guides; right side below the World Badge) onto their uniforms as shown before 22 February 2025.

For collection:

- Each member is encouraged to indicate the required number of theme patches and stamp cards via this link here at least a day before collection to prepare in advance.
- The number of theme patches to be collected should match the Unit's total strength. Patches for new Tweenies or Recruits can be collected later. Alternatively, Guiders may collect for them in advance if the allocated numbers are already known.
- Stamp Cards should correspond to the number of members attending on the day of celebrations.

As part of the "Record Breaking Mural" activity, Guiders and GGS members are encouraged to submit the completed fabric pieces done up by their Unit at the same time. (Refer to Section F)



Strict adherence to the requirements for fabric material, writing material, and size is essential.

H) STAMP CARD REDEMPTION - ACTUAL DAY



Collecting Stickers

- The Brownies/Guides will bring along their stamp cards as they explore the interactive booths.
- They will receive a sticker on their stamp card when they visit a booth.
- The sticker will be pasted in a blank corresponding to the zone of the booth

Redemption

- Merchandise Redemption:
 - The girls have to collect 5 stickers (1 from each zone) to redeem a merchandise item at the redemption counter.
- Photo Booth Access:
 - The girls have to collect 6 stickers: 5 stickers (one from each zone) + 1 additional sticker (from any zone) to take a group photo at the photo booth. The group must include at least one girl who has collected 8 stickers.

Stickers that have been redeemed will be crossed out on the stamp card. Crossed-out stickers cannot be reused for another redemption.

- 3. Excuse Letters:
 - GGS can provide excuse letters if needed. Rehearsals are compulsory, so please prioritize attendance. If a letter is required, inform HQ with the full details of your School Principal, School Name, and Address. The letter will be a generic one for your Brownie Pack or Guide Unit.

Unaccepted fabric materials	Satin, nylon, textured fabric, silk, chiffon, thin linen			
Designing the fabric piece	You may: o draw, write, paint, sew, or embroider o use fine tip markers, fabric markers, gel pens, or acrylic paint			
Guiding questions	You may use these questions to guide what can be written/designed on the fabric piece: What was the most meaningful memory of my Guiding journey? What makes me proud to be a Brownie/Guide? How can I positively influence others on my Guiding journey? What do I envision to become in the near future on my Guiding journey? Who are those around me that have helped me in my Guiding journey? What are my hopes for Guiding in the future?

Other pointers

- Fabric should NOT be frayed, having thin spots, tears, stains, or holes
- Fabric should NOT be made of sheer, thin, and waterproof materials
- Solid coloured fabric with minimal patterns are strongly encouraged
- Source your fabrics from:
 - T-shirts, jeans, shorts, sweatshirts, dress, scarfs, tote bags, old uniforms, scraps etc
