# Chief Commissioner's Award Badge (CCAB) Scrapbook

## Purpose

The CCAB Scrapbook records a Brownie's Guiding journey – her learning, service, and memories. It celebrates her growth as a loyal, helpful, and committed Brownie, ready to take her next step in Guiding.

## Scrapbook Presentation

- The Scrapbook is a **compulsory item** to be brought along by the candidate for the Oral Assessment.
- Candidate is to bring an iPad or a tablet to showcase her **digital** scrapbook
- Failure to bring the scrapbook **will disqualify** the candidate from the assessment.

Candidates may present her scrapbook in either format:

- Hardcopy (neatly compiled in a ring file, folder, or bound book), or
- Online scrapbook (created in Google Slides, PowerPoint, Canva, or any tool that can be saved as a PDF or presented directly online).
- All pages should be neat, well-labelled, and clearly organised.

## Presentation Guidelines

The scrapbook should be neat, well-organised, and creatively presented. It should reflect her pride as a Brownie and her growth through her Guiding journey.

### General Presentation

1. **One Event per Page (Minimum)**  
Each event or activity should be presented clearly on its own page to show her learning and experiences.
2. **Visuals and Illustrations**  
Include her own **drawings, pictures, or photographs** related to Guiding activities (e.g. *World Thinking Day, Brownie Revel, Pack Holiday*, community service, etc.). These visuals make your scrapbook more personal and meaningful.
3. **Format**  
She may choose to **handwrite or type** her entries.  
All hardcopy entries must be **compiled neatly**.
4. **Content Page**  
Include a **Content Page** at the beginning with **matching page numbers**.  
Start her scrapbook from **earlier years to recent years** to show her Guiding progress.

## Presentation/Layout

- Keep layout clear and tidy.
- Use simple captions and short paragraphs.
- Label each section clearly.
- Write in candidate's own words – sincerity matters most.

### Cover Page Instructions

Each candidate must include a Cover Page as the first page of her scrapbook. This helps to identify her work clearly and ensures all important information is recorded neatly.


Contents	Writing/Reflection Guidelines
<p><b>Part 1:</b> <b>Historical Section</b></p> <p>Include 3 historical events from <i>Singapore</i> Girl Guiding: One from each period/decade of our history.</p>	<p>Each event entry should have two parts: a <b>Description</b> and a <b>Reflection</b>.</p> <p> <b>Description</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Clearly state the <b>name and year</b> of the event.</li> <li>Briefly describe <b>what the event was about</b> and <b>why it was meaningful or interesting</b> to her as a Brownie.</li> </ul> <p> <b>Reflection</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify <b>one value</b> (e.g. teamwork, helpfulness, responsibility) and <b>one skill</b> (e.g. communication, leadership, problem-solving) that she learned.</li> <li>Explain <b>how she displays this value in her daily life</b>, at home or in school.</li> <li>Share <b>how she applies this skill</b> to help herself and others.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Part 2:</b> <b>Personal Brownie Journey</b></p> <p>Document 3 events that the candidate personally took part in.</p>	<p>To document on all the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1 Pack-organised activity or event</li> <li>1 Division-organised event</li> <li>1 HQ-organised event</li> </ul> <p>For each activity, include the event name and date, a brief description, photos or evidence (if available), and a short reflection on what she learned or enjoyed most.</p>
<p><b>Part 3:</b> <b>Evidence of Involvement/ Participation</b></p> <p>a. Pack Holiday (PH)/ International Camp (Compulsory)</p> <p>b. iPlog Reflection (Compulsory)</p> <p>c. A short write-up on her PH experience.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><i>Certificates will not be collected by HQ but may be included in the scrapbook.</i></li> </ul> <p>b. Print or summarise her <b>iPlog Level 2</b> reflection, focusing on what she has learned.</p> <p>c. Description of her chosen service and reflection on what she learned through helping others.</p>

## Uniform and Badge Placement


Please refer to how Proficiency and Interest Badges should be sewn as shown below.

### Order of sewing badges on sleeves:

1. All Proficiency Badges in pairs (right sleeve). When a Brownie has earned more than 3 pairs, the 7th and 8th badges should flank the top pair of Proficiency Badges.
2. When she has earned more than 12 Proficiency Badge, the 13th badge and thereafter may be sewn on the sash that can be worn across the uniform.
3. Similarly, Interest/Partners/WAGGGS badges should be sewn on the left sleeve of the uniform.
